As you are enjoying this issue of "Platter Chatter" we will have entered another New Year. With the support of our donors and senior clients, we are happy to project serving more than 42,000 freshly prepared meals in 2023. Our senior client lists continue to increase each week. It is joyful to witness referrals coming from doctors, case managers, hospice services, and current clients.

Meals of Joy takes pride in delivering freshly prepared meals served hot and ready to eat upon delivery. Our knock on the door of a homebound senior could signal the arrival of the only person they might see all day, or all week long. It brings HOPE, HEALTH, NUTRITION, and CARE that will completely make their day. Many seniors are living on less than \$250 per week. Their expenses for housing and medical care, along with inflated food costs, means little money left to pay for food. ONE in FOUR SENIORS live ALONE. ONE IN FOUR SENIORS FEEL LONELY. Home-delivered meals can be invaluable for elderly adults living alone, and it's a cost-effective way to keep seniors independent.

In January, we will begin our first *Senior Social Luncheon*. These luncheons will be served in the dining areas of various local churches once per month. We are happy to announce that the Desert Palms Presbyterian Church will be the first to establish this program. The luncheon will focus on seniors primarily living home alone within the church parish. Creating a social time within the churches is our goal.

Chef's Corner

CHEF JACK, MEALS OF JOY

Today, I'm writing to you about how high inflation is affecting food prices and how it impacts the senior community.

Overall, inflation in June of 2022 climbed to 9.1% over one year ago as measured by the consumer price index—the fastest rise in more than 40 years. The cost of groceries rose 12.2% during the past year, an increase that can be especially painful for people with low incomes.

Higher prices also mean that many common food items such as meat and fruit can, and have been, in short supply. This makes shopping and meal planning very difficult. My staff shops almost everyday to ensure we have adequate supplies and tries to maintain reasonable prices. On an average day we shop 4-8 suppliers. The staff that prepares your meals everyday works hard to make fresh nutritious meals while trying to hold down food costs!

They are the perfect addition to extend your weekday meal plan. If you're interested in the Weekender, they must be ordered by Wednesday and are delivered on Fridays. On Tuesdays and Thursdays we offer your choice of soup or chili served with a half sandwich and fruit.

Now, a question for you: would you like a second weekend meal? Since we currently offer a half sandwich with our soup or chili would you prefer a full sandwich with soup or chili for a little more cost?
